## WHAT SHOULD YOU BRING TO CAMP?

Camp Micah is excited to join forces with 18 other Maine Camp Experience member camps to support World of Change - a new nonprofit with plans for harnessing the \$10 billion in loose change sitting idle in households across the US. The approach is simple - use experiential engagement to empower kids and communities to dream of and create wide scale change.

Between now and the start of camp, kids can start collecting change to bring with them. Campers will then have the opportunity to learn more about World of Change during the summer, and choose from specific programs in six focus areas (housing, childhood literacy, food security, health and wellness, financial literacy, and children's play). very thorough review process which includes analyzing every aspect of the Camp Micah experience. It has always been and will continue to be our commitment to improve on our already high standards and make the next year better than the last.

With this in mind, we have partnered with Ivy Oaks Analytics, a public health company based out of Virginia that specializes in the control of ticks, and poison ivy at large mosauitoes, campgrounds, parks, and summer camps. Ivy Oaks works with over 40 premier summer camps in the northeast.

Although this has never been a major issue at Camp Micah, we feel very strongly that we have an obligation to our camp community to do everything in our power to reduce the risks associated with ticks, mosquitoes, and poison ivy.

Their process includes ongoing tick population measurements, landscape modification, natural control methods, and more, Micah is proud to be one of the few camps nationally with an advanced public health standards certification by implementing this program.
